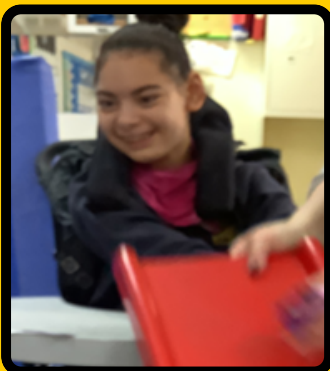
PLUTO CLASS NEWS
